What is Child Protection about?

All of the adults around you think that your health, safety and welfare are very important.

In our school, we respect our children and help to protect their rights.

We do our best to help children make good educational progress.

We teach children how to recognise risks in different situations, and how to protect themselves and stay safe.

How will we try to protect children?

We try to provide a safe environment for you to learn in;

We want to help to ensure that you remain safe, at home as well as at school;

We think it is important for you to know where to get help if you are worried or unhappy about something.

Staff and Visitors

All staff and visitors to your school have to sign in at the office and wear a lanyard round their neck or an orange sticker with the school name and date on.



If you see someone around school who isn't wearing any badge then you must tell a member of staff straight away.

Is someone bullying you?

You must tell your parents/carers, someone at school or someone you trust so they can help you.

Has someone said something to you or have you heard something that you do not like or upsets you?

You must tell your parents/carers, someone at school or someone you trust so they can help you.

Has someone made you feel uncomfortable about how or where they have touched you?

You must tell your parents/carers, someone at school or someone you trust so they can help you.

Has someone hit, punched or smacked you and hurt you in any way?

You must tell your parents/carers, someone at school or someone you trust so they can help you.

E-safety

Have you received any text messages that have upset or worried you?

Has anyone sent you an unkind message or threatened you?

Have you seen anything on your phone or computer that has upset or worried you?

Has someone from the Internet asked you to do anything that made you feel uncomfortable?
